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

































Ketamine: • First synthesized in 1962, Arylcyclohexylamine • Approved in US in 1970 for general anesthesia • On WHO list of essential medicines • "Dissociative anesthetic" • Extremely safe track record with medical use • Most popular agent for procedural sedation and analgesia in ED, intensive and acute care, burn patients, children, and in field medicine for trauma • Pain management, chronic pain and palliative/hospice care

Ketamine:

- Different ROA (IV, IM, IN, SQ, SL)
- Short duration of action, short half life
- Extensive liver metabolism by cytochrome P450 (CYP 3A4)
- Minimal respiratory and cardiovascular effects
- Generic medication, very cheap



Ketamine in Psychiatry

- 1. The only legal psychedelic available for clinical use!
- 2. Rapid antidepressant effect
- 3. Dramatic reduction in suicidal ideation
- 4. Wide range of positive studies in psychiatry- TRD, PTSD




Ketamine in Psychiatry

- Antidepressant effects known for decades, 1970s
- Research into rapid anti-depressant effects in 1990s (Berman et al. 2000; Krystal et al. 1994)
- Multiple follow up studies provided evidence of efficacy (60-70%) in TRD using IV infusion (Zarate 2006)
- Remissions were short lived, IV protocol was developed with repeated infusions
- "Growing evidence supports ketamine's robust and fast antidepressant and anti suicidal response, effects that are prolonged with repeated and continued treatment" (Sanacora 2018)
- Single ketamine infusion found to rapidly relieve Suicidal Ideation independent of mood relieving effect. (Krystal 2007, meta review by Wilkinson 2018)

Ketamine in Psychiatry

- 2017 APA Consensus guidelines on use of Ketamine to treat mood disorders
- 2019 Esketamine (Spravato) FDA-approved for refractory depression (TRD) in conjunction with a regular antidepressant under direct observation and supervision.
- All other use of Ketamine is off label
 - Phase 2 trials: Suicidal ideation, psychiatric symptoms associated with serious illness, palliative care, PTSD, OCD, pain, drug resistant epilepsy, Depression associated with Parkinson's Disease





Depression and Neurotransmitters

- Monoamine hypothesis no longer holds
- Antidepressants (MAOs, TCAs, SSRIs, SNRIs) take long to work and are largely (30-40%) ineffective
- Most classic psychedelics work on serotonin receptors (5HT2A)
 - LSD, Psilocybin, Mescaline
- Antidepressants interfere with the action of most psychedelics
- Ketamine works on the glutamine signaling and synaptic plasticity

Ketamine psychopharmacology

- Selective antagonist of the NMDA glutamate receptor at GABAergic interneurons (PFC, Hippocampus)
- AMPA receptor activation and BDNF release
- Downstream effects promoting synaptogenesis and neuroplasticity
- Other receptor pathways including opioid, dopamine, Ach (nicotinic and muscarinic), sigma

Ketamine pharmacology number and mGluR2/3 antagonist function NMDA Synaptin proteins, GluA1 and PSD95 Glutamate Glutamate burst; BDNF, synaptic plasticity WVDCC ACh-M. Scopolamine Stress and cortisol. inflammation. diabetes, obesity, cardiovascular disease

Ketamine effects on Nervous System

There is growing convergent evidence that effects involve neuroplastic
changes that extend beyond the presence of drug in the body, suggesting
there is an optimal window of time while brain is more malleable to
engage in other forms of psychosocial treatments.



Indications:

- Depression (TRD, Bipolar)
- Suicidal ideation
- Trauma (PTSD, cPTSD, developmental)
- Anxiety
- Life threatening illness

- End of Life
- Being stuck
- Compulsive behaviors (OCD)
- Maladaptive patterns (Personality d/o)
- Psycho-spiritual growth

Ketamine and Treatment:

Psychiatric/Medical Evaluation Contraindication:


- Thought Disorder (Schizophrenia)
- Active Psychosis
- Active Mania, recent mania, hypomania
- Disorganized Personality (BPD)
- Severe Substance Use
- Caution with severe trauma

- Heart Disease
- Aneurysm
- Unstable HTN
- Liver Disease
- Pregnancy
- Unstable thyroid disease
- Allergy to Ketamine
- Caution with Sleep Apnea

KAP phenomenology

- Dissociation
- Out of body
- Changes in perception, cognition, emotion
- Mood enhancement
- Anxiety reducing

- Hallucinations, vivid imagery, sensory distortions
- Ego reduction, dissolving
- Transcendence of space and time
- Mystical experiences
- Sense of oneness and connection




What is Ketamine-Assisted Psychotherapy?


- High intensity, short term treatment, but can be flexible
- It is an adjunct to ongoing therapy, patients return to their therapist
- -KAP is combining psychotherapy with the administration of ketamine.
- This allows for rich opportunity: being altered while participating in therapy can allow for deep shifts in perspective and opportunities for change and growth.
- -Clients are matched with a therapist who works with clients by first establishing a relationship/rapport, working to prep clients for treatment, and doing integration sessions.


Therapy in an Altered State

- Shift from the intellectual understanding of one's issues and struggles to a internalized felt shift.
- Significant felt shifts around ones understanding of self, others, and the way one interacts with their environment.
- Accelerated form of treatment.
- Ketamine is a "dissociative" not the same as how the word is used in therapy, allows people a perspective on who they are
